Jimmy Ewing, Jr. of District 2, Ralph B. Chustz, Sr. of District 4 and Eric Elliott of District 6, were recently re-elected without opposition to serve on the PC Electric Board of Directors.

They will begin their new three-year terms at a meeting of the board immediately following the PC Electric Annual Membership Meeting on Wednesday, February 9, 2022.

The directors are elected by members from the seven districts comprising the service area of PC Electric. Directors must be PC Electric members who reside in the district they represent.

The seven directors comprising the PC Electric Board (Lucky Number 30601) are responsible for managing the business and affairs of the electric cooperative. They exercise all of the powers of the cooperative except such as are by law, the Articles of Incorporation or the cooperative by-laws conferred upon or reserved to the members.

All High School Seniors who are members of PC Electric are eligible to enter! Also eligible to enter are high seniors who attend the following schools:

- Iberville Parish: Plaquemine High, St. John High and Math, Science and Arts Academy-West
- Pointe Coupee Parish: Livonia High, False River Academy, Catholic High of Pointe Coupee and STEM Academy
- West Baton Rouge Parish: Port Allen High School

Contest Rules: Students must write a formal letter approximately 500 words to an elected official. Students, this is the perfect opportunity to voice your personal opinion to your elected officials on any issue, problem, or success. In the letter, the topic of concern should be stated and thoroughly discussed. The letter should be addressed to the respective local, state or federal official in formal letter format. Obscene or offensive material will not be accepted and will automatically be disqualified. Good luck to all and have fun writing.

Guidelines and Information: The department staff shall consider the following criteria in selecting the recipients of the scholarship:

- (A) Applicant/Recipient must have a parent or legal guardian who is a member of and receives electricity from PC Electric OR attends one of our adopted schools listed above.
- (B) Applicant/Recipient must have maintained at least a 2.5 overall GPA in high school.
- (C) Applicant/Recipient must include a copy of his/her high school grades transcript.
- (D) Applicant/Recipient must be entering his/her freshman year of higher education.
- (E) Applicant/Recipient must be a full-time student.

Format of Letter

- 1. Complete the attached application and staple a copy of your transcript to the application. Paper clip the application and transcript to your letter.
- 2. Letter must be in the format of a formal letter, typed and double spaced.
- 3. Do not sign your letter. Simply sign or end your letter as follows: A Concerned Student, A Thankful Student, A Grateful Student, etc.
- 4. Contestants should keep a personal copy of letter.
- Deadline is March 7, 2022 by 4:30 PM

This soup is the easy way to do cabbage rolls.... all the taste without the work. Tender cabbage, a tasty tomato broth, rice, and ground beef makes one hearty soup.

INGREDIENTS

1/2 medium onion chopped 1 pound extra lean ground

4 cloves garlic minced 3 cups cabbage chopped

1 (14 fluid ounce) can toma-

1 (28 fluid ounce) can fire-roasted

diced tomatoes with juices 4 cups beef broth

1 cup water

1 teaspoon paprika

2/3 cup uncooked white rice

Salt & pepper or seasoning of choice to taste

CABBAGE ROLL SOUP

INSTRUCTIONS

- •Add the ground beef and onion to a large soup pot and cook it over medium-high heat, stirring occasionally, until the beef is browned (about 8 minutes). If (Lucky Number 1853100) there's a lot of excess fat, spoon most of it out.
- •Stir in the garlic, followed by the cabbage, tomato sauce, diced tomatoes, broth, water, paprika, and rice.
- •Increase the heat to high and bring the soup to a boil. Once it's just started to boil, give it a good stir, then reduce the heat and cover the pot with the lid slightly ajar. Let it simmer for 15-20 minutes or until the rice is cooked stirring halfway through to make sure the rice doesn't stick to the bottom of the pot.
- •Season soup with salt & pepper (Lucky Number 2193705) or your choice of seasoning as needed and serve immediately.
