This Sopapilla Cheesecake recipe is a cinnamon lover's dream! Cream cheese filling in a cinnamon-sugar crescent roll crust makes for an easy dessert.

#### **Ingredients:**

- 2 (8oz.) packs of Pillsbury crescent rolls
- 2 (8oz.) packs of cream cheese, room temperature
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1/4 cup butter (melted)
- 1 tablespoon cinnamon
- 4 tablespoons sugar
- \* honey

#### **Instructions**

- •Preheat the oven to 350 degrees.
- •Spray 9 x 13 baking dish with cooking spray.
- Press a can of the crescent rolls to the bottom of the dish, making sure to reach edges and keep together.
- Bake the first layer of crescent roll dough till just done approximately
- 5-8 minutes.
- •Combine softened cream cheese, sugar, and vanilla.
- •Spread mixture over crescent rolls.
- •Roll the remaining crescent roll over the top and stretch to the edges and seal.
- •Brush across the entire top of the crescent roll with the melted butter.
- •Sprinkle the top with 1 tablespoon cinnamon and 4 tablespoons of sugar.
- •Bake for about 30 minutes, or (Lucky Number 118400) until golden brown.
- •Let cool before serving.
- •Slice into triangles or squares, drizzle with a little honey if you like and serve.




Our office will be closed March 22, 2022 for the Annual Meeting. A dispatcher will be on duty to take outage and emergency calls.

PC Electric Linemen Complete

### POLE TOP RESCUE TRAINING

In the summer of 1967, Randall G. Champion, a 29-year-old apprentice lineman, was performing maintenance work atop a power pole when he touched one of the low-voltage cables and took an electric shock, losing consciousness and getting hung up in the safety harness.

Champion's partner, J.D. Thomas, noticed him dangling and unresponsive from the top of the pole. Thomas quickly climbed the pole, reached him, and performed mouthto-mouth resuscitation. After some time, Thompson could detect a faint pulse, unhooked Champion from his harness, and carried him down.

Once on the ground, Thompson and another worker performed CPR. By the time paramedics arrived, Champion was moderately revived and eventually made a full recovery.



In an incident like this, the cooperative (Lucky Number 2402800) makes sure PC Electric linemen are skilled and ready in pole top rescue. "It is very important to practice these procedures, so that we can help our fellow employees in the event that this situation would ever occur," said Chad Nichols, safety training and project coordinator for PC Electric.

This exercise simulates a lineman having an electrical contact injury and becoming unconscious at the top of a pole. The exercise begins with a 150 lb. dummy

secured to the top of a pole by a safety harness. Each lineman is required to climb the pole wearing approximately 30 pounds of equipment which consists of climbing hooks attached to their boots, a climbing belt, and

a safety harness that goes around the pole. Once they reach the dummy, they are required to secure a rope around the dummy's chest, loop the rope over a cross arm, then lower the dummy to the ground.

PC Electric linemen are trained yearly to recognize a victim in trouble on a power pole, call for assistance, climb the pole, safely lower the victim, and begin first aid to someone that may be incapacitated while doing linework.

In addition to doing pole top rescue, employees are certified in CPR.

Safety is our number one priority. We want all of our employees to return to their families each night.
